<p><b>About us:</b></p>	<p>Mallee Sexual Assault Unit (MSAU) and Mallee Domestic Violence Service (MDVS) is a not-for-profit community organisation that provides family, domestic and sexual violence services and advocacy to support everyone in the Mallee region to be safe. Funded primarily by the Victorian Department of Families, Fairness and Housing, we deliver a range of programs focused on prevention, safety, connection and healing. Our programs span from crisis care to therapeutic services providing specialist support for victim survivors of sexual or family violence from first contact through to recovery.</p> <p>We are committed to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensuring victim survivors of family violence are safe and those who use violence are held accountable.</li> <li>• Welcoming and supporting people of all backgrounds, ethnicities, cultures, ages, gender identities, sexual orientations, and abilities.</li> <li>• Recognising children as victim survivors of family violence in their own right, and being a child safe organisation</li> <li>• Providing seamless integration of care between providers to ensure best possible outcomes and experience for clients</li> <li>• Providing specialist care that is trauma informed, strengths based, and evidence informed</li> </ul> <p>The Mallee Sexual Assault Unit - Mallee Domestic Violence Services provides services to victim survivors of sexual assault and domestic and or family violence. The components of the service consist of crisis care, counselling services, advocacy, community education, outreach support, information, and referral services. The service is non-discriminatory, providing equity of access to all victim survivors and significant others of sexual assault and domestic and or family violence.</p> <p>In the Northern Mallee region, centre-based sexual assault and family violence services are provided in Mildura (24-hour response). Services are also provided flexibly and on-demand in Robinvale, Ouyen, Mallee Track, Dareton, and Wentworth.</p> <p>In the Southern Mallee, centre-based sexual assault and family violence services are provided in Swan Hill (24-hour response). Services are also provided flexibly and on-demand in Kerang, Cohuna, Sea Lake, Wycheproof, Balranald, and other towns throughout the Buloke and Gannawarra Shire.</p>

<b>Position Objectives</b>	<p>Justice Navigators work as part of specialist sexual assault support services to provide support to victim survivors of sexual violence to understand their rights and support options.</p> <p>Justice Navigators provide independent specialist support to victim survivors of sexual offending to help them to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• understand and access their rights; and</li> <li>• navigate justice and recovery options.</li> </ul> <p>Justice Navigators work independently to help victim survivors navigate services and systems including but not limited to criminal justice processes including reporting to police, court processes, civil processes and claims, complaints processes, restorative justice options, and universal services.</p> <p>Justice Navigators provide strengths based and trauma-informed navigation support but do not provide therapeutic care or counselling.</p>
<b>Key responsibilities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Support victim survivors of sexual violence to understand and exercise their rights, and support them to navigate justice, compensation, and recovery options.</li> <li>• Provide trauma-informed, specialist, practical support to victim-survivors, including impartial and accurate information about their rights and entitlements.</li> <li>• Engage in case planning, intervention, review, and closure processes for clients.</li> </ul>



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide support and information to secondary victims such as children, friends and family members (with the consent of victim survivor).</li> <li>• Build the capacity of other professionals and sectors to work with and advocate for victim survivors of sexual violence.</li> <li>• Work collaboratively with existing legal supports, local Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations and other services in Victoria, including facilitating warm referrals to services that can support victim survivor’s healing and recovery.</li> <li>• Lead and maintain engagement with local Aboriginal communities and Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations to embed cultural safety within service provision, with a focus on continuous improvement and minimising cultural load for ACCOs.</li> <li>• Work collaboratively with, but independently from, justice agencies and professionals to progress the needs and preferences of victim survivors.</li> <li>• Translate complex legal terminology and processes into language that victim survivors can understand.</li> <li>• Advise and participate in continuous improvement activities to improve the operation of justice and other systems from the perspective of victim survivors of sexual violence.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Key Selection Criteria</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Relevant tertiary qualifications in social work, psychology, counselling, law or other related discipline.</li> <li>• Demonstrated experience and skills in supporting survivors of sexual violence, with a strong knowledge of the dynamics of such violence, and the social and legal context in which it occurs.</li> <li>• Demonstrated experience and knowledge of the provision of a service based on an intersectional feminist, rights advocacy, violence and trauma informed practice framework.</li> <li>• Excellent communication (verbal and written), negotiation and advocacy skills.</li> <li>• Strong understanding of Victorian justice and recovery service offerings and how to negotiate and advocate with multiple service systems to support the needs of clients and their families.</li> <li>• Demonstrated experience and expertise in trauma-informed practice, preferably in a similar trauma recovery context or another area of trauma-focused service provision.</li> <li>• Demonstrated experience conducting psychosocial assessments and risk assessments of adults and families.</li> <li>• Ability to work collaboratively and within a cross-cultural context including working with other services and professionals.</li> <li>• A strong understanding of intersectionality and how to work accessibly and effectively with victim survivors who experience increased barriers to safety and justice.</li> </ul>
